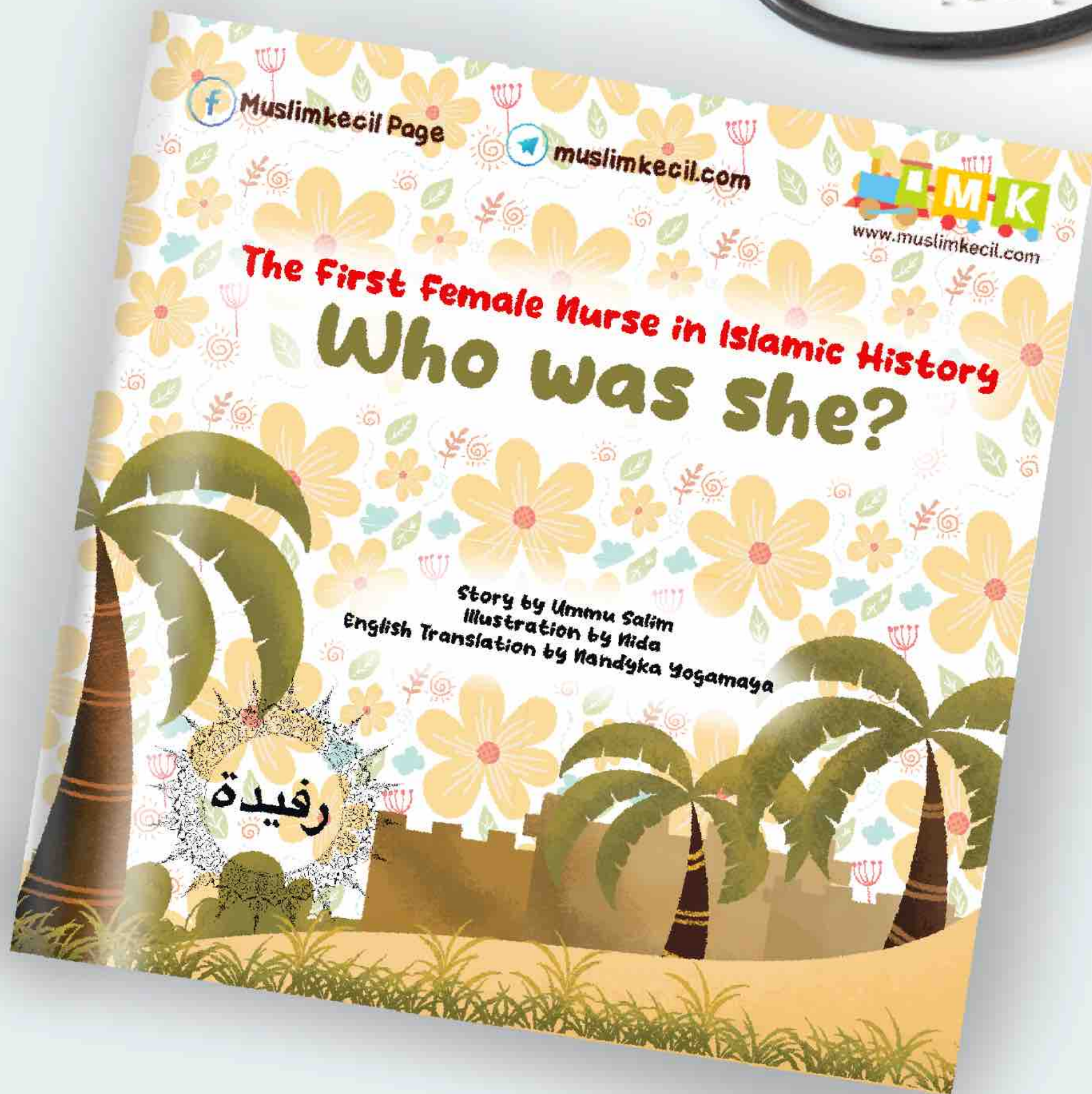
The First Female Nurse in Islamic History **Who was she?**
