



MOM'S COLORFUL CHICKEN SOUP

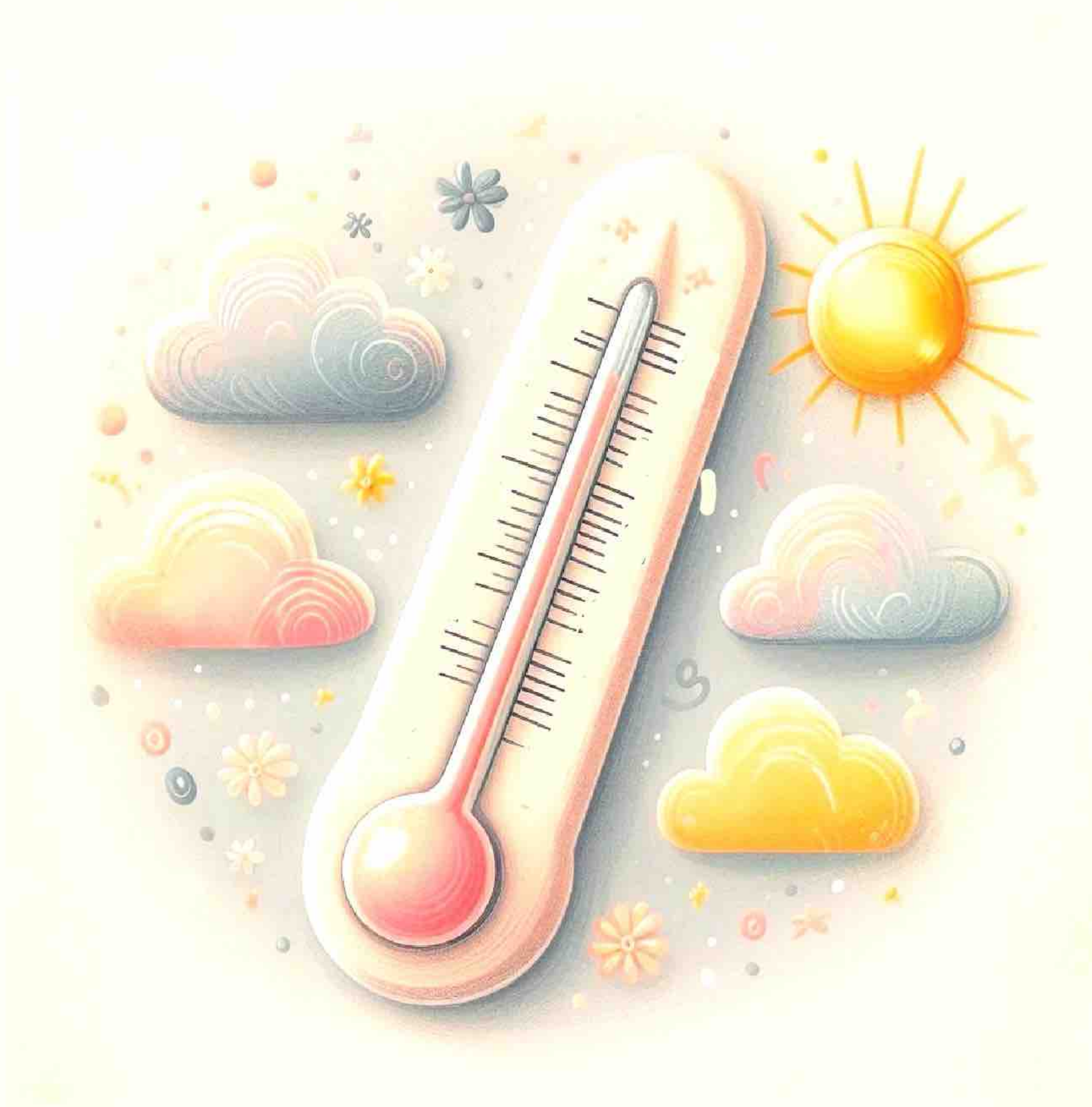
